In the only interview the German financial delegation has given since its arrival in Paris. Between April 5 and April 12, the Germans spent eight hours daily before the reparations commission-French members alone absenting themselves-studying accounts, asking further information and seeking basis to be used in calculating amounts set down.

Reparations bills were presented in gold pounds, paper pounds, gold and paper francs, gold and paper lire, all sorts of money and all sorts of standards, instead of uniform and blanxet explanations, and lump sums were mentioned instead of itemized accounts, explaining how the totals were reached.


