Many Recommendations on **Export Business** Covered In Report of Eighth National Convention.

Cleveland, May 8. - With the unanimous adoption of the foreign trade program for the coming year as recommended by the general convention committee, copies of which will be sent to President Harding, members of his cabinet and of congress, the eighth annual convention of the National Foreign Trade council closed.

The report of the committee is a composite embodiment of all practical recommendations brought forward by international experts at the convention.

Every phase of the world's export business - credits, exchange rates, taxation, tariffs, mercantile marine, domestic transportation, consular service and other problems of im-porters and exporters-is covered. porters and exporters-is covered. Exchange of scholarships between

Mexico and the United States and tacilities which Mexico will provide in this connection, was the subject of a letter from President Obregon of Mexico, which was warmly applauded.

Broad principles on which the convention made declaration include: Immediate creation of financial institutions under the Edge law to facilitate extension of long term forcign credits and promote free exchange of imports and exports.

Economies in cost and production until a stable balance of all values of all commodities and productive effort is established. Encouragement and development

of the American merchant marine, revision of shipping laws to place America on an equal footing with foreign competitors and enactment of the marine insurance measure now pending in congress.


