Not Fear Germany, **Hoover Asserts**

Cost of Teuton Production Lowered by Currency Inflation-Financial Structure May Collapse.

By HOLLAND.

Charles M. Schwab, Henry P. Schwarz and others who have re-cently visited Germany, have spoken since their return to the United States of the industrial activity which seems to them to have permeated the German wage earners. They also have spoken in words of warning of the danger which German competition is now establishing with certain commodities in the markets of the world and particularly our own domestic markets. These are facts which have been gathered by men competent to make observa-It remained, however, for the Secretary of Commerce Hooyer, to

explain why it is possible for German industry to gain such efficiency and secure such low cost of produc-It remained, however, for tion. market steel in England at a price far below that which English steel manufacturers must ask and why Germany is putting pregumatic tools in the automobile manufacturing centers of the United States in successful competition with the American manufacturers of these articles.

Germans can Undersell.

Mr. Hoover does not disagree with Mr. Schwab and the others so far as the facts are concerned. He admits that these facts have been accurately stated but he does more than Mr. Schwab and the others have done. They referred to the low wages, to the efficiency, to the spirit of sacrifice and to the practice of economy which now characterize the German workingmen. Mr. Hoover goes farther. In his testimony before the ways and means committee of the house of representatives he stated that the denartment of commerce has already investigated the cost of production in Germany and has discovered why this cost has been reduced to such an extent as to make it possible for German industry already to undersell other nations with some of their products.

The German government, Mr. Hoover has discovered, is subsidizing production of all kinds and is maintaining fictitious low prices by currency inflating. He estimates that about \$80,800,000,000 marks, are in this subsidy so that the government is really paying much of the losses in all lines of industry.
