Representative Johnson Calls Court-Martial of Officers Following Escape of Draft Dodger Half - Hearted.

Chicago Tribune-Omaha Bee Leased Wire, Washington, May 10 .- Charges that the court-martial trial of army officers alleged to be responsible for the escape of Grover Cleveland Bergdoll, the draft slacker, was "a whitewash," were made by Repre-sentative Johnson of Kentucky, a niember of the house committee investigating the Bergdoll case.

Representative Johnson expressed himself with considerable vigor at the close of today's hearing, after listening for hours to the testimony of Col. John E. Hunt, retired, commander at Fort Jay, where Berg-doll was confined. Colonel Hunt was one of the men court-martialed. He was found not guilty and later retired from the army because of ill-health.

After reading portions of the transcripts of Colonel Hunt's trial, Representative Johnson declared:

"I expect to show from this record that there is enough to warrant more than a suspicion that there was a whitewash in the courtmartial trial and that the counsel who conducted the trial was a party to the whitewash by the halfhearted prosecution he made. I am ready now to take up the record and furnish additional proof of my statements."

Johnson Irritated.

The committee, at this juncture, adjourned until tomorrow to consider whether it would publish the whole of the court-martial proceed-ings as a part of its record. Representative Johnson was irritated because other members of the committee indicated a lack of sympathy with the method of his cross-examination. Several times Chairman Peters reminded him that the witness was only very recently out of

the hospital. In the portions of the transcript which Representative Johnson read Colonel Cresson, who prosecuted the case, was quoted as stating that Colonel Hunt's responsibility was technical in its nature and that "no one in the whole army was more sorry for Bergdoll's escape than Colonel Hunt," Representative Johnson contended that this should ze taken as proof of a "whitewash." Mrs. Emina C. Bergdoll, mother of the escaped elacker, will not go on the stand tomorrow, but probably will appear Thursday or Friday. Judge Wescott may be heard tomor row in reply to some of the state ments made by General Ansell.
