

\$35,000 Raised In Jewish Drive

Campaign to Raise Funds for Welfare Work to Be Continued.

Pledges totalling \$35,000 were reported in the three-day campaign this week for the Jewish Welfare Federation's annual budget. Eight hundred subscribers helped swell the total.

J. L. Brandeis & Sons head the list with \$3,000; Morris Levy gave \$2,000; William Holman and Harry A. Wolf, \$1,000 each, and Morris Miller, Jerome and Lester Heyn, Simon Brothers, Kirchbraun & Sons and Isidor Gluck, \$500 each.

Donations of less than \$50 each are in the majority.

A money subscribed will support Wase Memorial hospital, Jewish Old Peoples home, Cleveland Orphan asylum, consumptive hospitals in Denver, besides local relief. Y. M. H. A. and Y. W. H. A. work.

The campaign committee of 150 members will meet Sunday morning at 9:30 in the Lyric building to plan for the windup. A separate drive is planned for the South Side.

Boys Nab Youth Who Injured Girl

Bicyclist Who Knocked Down Crippled Child Pursued By Posses of Pupils.

George Wilkinson, 14, 2624 North Nineteenth street, was caught yesterday afternoon in the Holy Family Catholic church school, Nineteenth and Izard streets, by a posse of boys who turned the juvenile fugitive over to police. Master Wilkinson was charged with running down Fannie Zidman, 10, 707 North Sixteenth street, while riding his bicycle in the Cass school yard.

Wilkinson rode into the school yard and knocked down several boys and girls, with his bicycle before he struck the Zidman girl, who is paralyzed on one side and was unable to escape the oncoming bicycle, according to reports to police.

Miss Jessie Grant, principal of Cass school, at first tried to apprehend Wilkinson, but when her efforts failed, she summoned several of her boy pupils, who mounted bicycles and gave chase. The boys who joined in the pursuit are Tom Wells, Al Gray, Theodore Sterling and Tommy Thomas. The injuries suffered by the Zidman girl may prove serious on account of her condition.
