Joplin, Mo., May 22.—(Special Telegram.)—Omaha mauled, murdered and took everything Joplin had this afternoon. The Buffaloes copped the opener, 12 to 5 and the twilight affair, 11 to 1.

The first game was close for a spell, with the Miners trying the count at the five run milestone, but the Buffaloes tacked on seven more and held the locals.
