Rains over a good part of the wheat country have taken the dull edge off the market and changed sentiment to considerable extent. All grains had good bulges at times, which ran into liquidating and profit-taking sales which carried them off. At the close wheat was 1/4¢ lower, with May leading...

Omaha, May 27.—Cash wheat prices today ranged unchanged to a cent lower. Corn was generally 1/4¢ to 1/2¢ up. Oats ranged unchanged to a cent higher. No. 2 white oats were generally a cent up and No. 3 advanced 3/4¢. Rye and barley were nominal. Grain receipts today slower, very liberal runs of both wheat and corn, and also an increase in oats. Wheat arrivals were 120 cars, corn 112 and oats 36, making a total of 268 cars against only 43 cars received last Friday.
