Crop Conditions Near Normal in South Platte; Grain Is Moving and Outlook for Business Good Opinion of All Excursionists Who Made Tour of Southern Nebraska.

Filled with confidence produced by direct contact with their customers in 120 towns of southern Nebraska and northern Kansas, the 86 members of the trade excursion of the Omaha Chamber of Commerce arrived at the Union station shortly after Saturday night.

The small grain is not in the best condition because of cold weather and in certain districts rain is needed.
