The weather of the past week has been so wholly unusual that it is difficult to estimate its effect on the progress of the crops. As charted by the U.S. weather bureau the extraordinary heat wave covered the whole interior of the continent. Chicago shows the center of the hot area, the temperature of that district averaging 15 degrees above normal. A district central about Omaha and extending nearly across lows had temperatures 12 degrees above normal. By Thursday morning, however, better conditions prevailed and the Chicago district got very much cooler weather than the Missouri valley. Rainfall for the early part of the week was very light and consisted of scattered showers in the upper Missouri valley and heavier eastward till they reached very respectable proportions in the eastern spring wheat country of Minnesota, Wisconsin and in Michigan and Ohio. By Tuesday northern and castern lows and most of South Dakota got good rains and a few points in Nebraska and Kansas got light showers, while rains continued in the cast. Thursday and Friday ample rains reached over the northern stretches of the corn beit from central Nebraska east and scattered showers through Kansas, Missouri and Oklahema.

The immediate effect of these conditions is to advance all interests in the spring wheat belt. In the corn belt there is doubtless a maximum stand of corn with both prompt start and rapid growth except in a few districts where the soll remains very dry.


