Witness Also Declares Money Was Offered Him to Say Accused Man Shot Miss Barton.

Kansas City, Mo., May 31 .- Fred Roberts, awaiting trial on a charge of first degree murder in connection with the death of Miss Florence Barton, today went on the stand in the defense of Denzel Chester on trial charged with the murder, declared Chester was with him the night of the tragedy, that neither of them had been near the scene of the tragedy, and then said that repeated attempts had been made by members of the Barton family to induce him to sign a statement saying that Chester was the man who fired the shot that killed Miss Bar-

Roberts said he was offered a garage in any town he cared to lo-cate in if he would sign such a statement "and more money than I had ever seen" and release from all charges pending against him. These offers were made to him a number of times, he said, while he was awaiting trial on a charge of highway robbery in St. Joseph, Mo.

Once he was taken to a dentist's office, he said, handcuffed to a deputy sheriff named Bush, then handcuffed to the dentist and kept there all afternoon, while an attempt was made to persuade him to sign a statement that Chester had fired the


