Washington, May 31.—"Babe" Ruth made his 15th home run today, sending the ball over the right field wall with two on base in the ninth inning, but New York lost to Washington, 12 to 5. It was Ruth's 118th home run of his major league career, and set a new major league record. The former record of 117 home runs was held by C. Cravath, formerly of the Philadelphia Nationals. The locals made eight consecutive hits off Hoyt in the second inning. Zachary got a double and three singles in four times at bat.
