## Rally In Last Inning Defeats Omaha, 5 to 4

### Spellman Wallops Homer in Ninth With Two On—Buffaloes Outfit Packers—Gislaon Stars.

The last inning of the opening game of the series with Sioux City yesterday afternoon at the Fifteenth and Vinton street park was disastrous for the Buffaloes. Mr. Barney Burch's herd being trampled under a 5 to 4 score.

And what caused all the excitement, and also defeat of the locals came from the bats of three Packers, spelling two singles and then a circuit clout by none other than Eddie Spellman, Sioux City catcher and former Omaha boy.

The Buffaloes were leading by two tallies when the Packers started to make things look different, but the locals could have salted the game away with 'unten runs had they used the old coco in the first couple of innings.

For instance, Gislaon started the initial stanza with a two-bagger. By the way, this white-topped left was hitting wild yesterday, getting two doubles and one triple off the delivery of Mr. Glezer. Hancey walked. Two men on base and none out. Mr. Lee poked the ball down to Marr.

Then, again in the second, Pug Griffin drew a free base, and advanced to second when O'Brien, who was hit by Glezer, limped to first. A sacrifice hit by Massey pushed both runners up a notch. Then the "star" play of the game happened. Pug attempted to walk home on the stellar Eddie Spellman, Sioux City's hero, but Eddie was too fast. A little running to third and a short peg to Marr put away Omaha's hope of scoring in the second.

In the meantime, Fox, lead-off man for the visitors, hit a little right over second, and advanced to Stembrenner's sacrifice. Pug Griffin muffed a hard catch of Paddock's fly and Box advanced to third, coming in home and scoring the first run of the game when Robinson poked a long sacrifice fly to right field.

In the last half of the third, Red Chingled, and came in home when Gislaon's double hit the right field fence. The Packers forged ahead in the fourth on Beaumiller's walk, an error by President Burch, and a driving double by Marr.

The Buffaloes took their first lead in the game in the sixth with two out. O'Brien singled, and then swiped second base. Massey's single brought the speedy O'Brien home. A long single by Cy Lingle drove Massey across the plate. Burch threw out to Stembrenner.

Score in Seventh. Omaha scored again in the seventh when Gislaon touched the center-field fence for a triple. Hancey flew out to Stembrenner. Billy Lee laid a perfect sacrifice hit to Glezer and Gislaon crossed the pentagon for the fourth tally.

Everything looked fine for Burch in the ninth, but—Robinson proceeded to fly out to Massey. Beaumiller singled and Marr reappeared. Then the former Omaha sandlotter stepped up to the plate. Spellman walloped out a long hit over the right field fence, and the two Packers crossed the plate. The locals attempted to rally in the ninth with two out. Hancey hit for a single, but died on base when Billy Lee sent a long fly out to left field, which Mr. Fox grabbed in de luxe style. The score:
