Buffaloes Lose Game of Series To Packers, 1-2

SiouX City Scores Winning Run in Ninth; Pitchers Battle Between Davenport and Russell.

SiouX City topped the first game of the series from the Buffaloes yesterday when the visitors finished victors, 2 to 1, in a pitcher's battle between "Slim" Davenport of the locals and "Lefty" Russell.

It was another one of those ninth inning raffles that caused victory to perch on the Packers' banner after the last Buff had his time at bat. The score was 1-0 at the first of the final round and Steinbrenner of SiouX City at bat. This packer singled to left field and advanced to second on Mason's error. Beaumiller whiffed and Graham drove in the winning run when he singled.

This ended one of the best games that has been staged at the fifteenth street lot thus far this season. Davenport pitched good ball throughout, but the Buffaloes simply couldn't hit Russell in the pinches. The packer shtuphad had a habit of tightening up with men on the bases and turned his opponents back more than once.

The Buffaloes got seven hits off the oerings o Russell, of these one was a double by Levitt and another triple by Gilsolon. Levitt's double to right field came in the initial round of the contest with Lee on first, and resulted in the speedy little Omaha left fielder charging the bags in Charlie Paddock's fashion, thereby scoring the lone Omaha tally of the game.

In the third inning Gilsolon slammed the ball out to deep left field for a triple. He was left stranded on the third bag, however, as Haney grounded out and Lee popped out to short, while Levitt retired the side when he grounded out to Russell.

Davenport allowed the Packers a single in the first, but the blow came after two hands were down. Metz ended his team's chances of scoring when he grounded out.
