Manhasset, N. Y., July 3. -Georges Carpentier broke his right thumb in two places and suffered a bad wrist sprain in the second round of his fight with Jack Dempsey in Jersey City yesterday. This was reported by Dr. Joseph Connolly of Glen Cover, N. Y., who examined him at his training camp tonight.

"Georges said he hurt the wrist in the second round when he hit Dempsey on the jaw, but that he did not think he had broken it."

"What effect, if any, this injury to the European challenger's most effective fighting fist, had on the ultimate outcome of the battle, it is impossible to state.
