Burns Finishes Conspiracy Tale In Ball Trial

Says Players Double-Crossed Gamblers on Third-Day Game—Makes Strong Impression.

Chicago, July 20.—Bill Burns, the state's chief strength in the base ball trial, today finished his story of how he and others conspired with eight Chicago White Sox players for them to throw the 1919 world series to Cincinnati. The admitted accomplice in the alleged sell-out then withdrew three hours, after re-racking cross-examination by two defense attorneys in which he fought a give and take battle, never weakening in the essential facts of his story, although several times badly confused on incidental details.
