Lincoln, July 29.—(Special.) - A levy of 3.30 mills will be necessary to meet state expenses for 1921, ac cording to a statement issued by W. R. Osborne, state tax commissioner. The valuation on which this levy will be placed is \$3,298,575,920.

The money necessary to keep the state government in operation is \$9,516,269.17. The 3.30-mill levy will raise \$9,895,727, which will take care of the capitol building fund.




