

State Tax Levy To Be 3.30 Mills Osborne Says

Over \$1,000,000 Extra Funds Must Be Provided This Year to Meet Legislative Appropriations.

Lincoln, July 29.—(Special.)—A levy of 3.30 mills will be necessary to meet state expenses for 1921, according to a statement issued by W. P. Osborne, state tax commissioner. The valuation on which this levy will be placed is \$3,298,573,920.

The money necessary to keep the state government in operation is \$9,516,269.17. The 3.30-mill levy will raise \$9,895,727, which will take care of the capitol building fund.

Extra expense this year, due to appropriations by the last legislature, include the following:

State reformer for men	\$200,000.00
Capitol building fund	100,000.00
Administrative expenses	100,000.00
Deficiencies of former appropriations	264,269.17
Total	\$664,269.17

The remainder include salaries, maintenance, one-half of biennium appropriations for buildings at various state institutions, cost of highway construction and other activities of the state government.

The levy is made this year on full valuation for the first time under a law passed by the last legislature.

In the past levies have been made on one-fifth valuation. The levy last year was 10.39 mills on one-fifth valuation, which would have been 2,078 mills on a full valuation.

Defunct Insurance Company Is Rapidly Liquidating Claims

Lincoln, July 29.—(Special.)—Liquidation of the defunct Bankers' Automobile Insurance association is progressing rapidly and with less loss than originally expected, according to a statement by J. E. Hart, secretary of the department of trade and commerce. His report summarized, contains the following facts:

Accrued losses amounting to \$84,348.95 have been paid and a reserve of \$36,428.84 is still held to cover losses in court or not yet adjusted. The sum of \$34,000 borrowed by the company was paid in full July 11.

On December 31, 1920, \$54,999.36 was due the company from its agents and between December 30, 1920 and April 15, 1921, new business amounting to \$51,501.14 was written and charged to the agents. Of this aggregate amount only \$15,922.27 remains uncollected.

Despite the tight condition of the money market the state department has disposed of \$178,000 in securities for \$166,158.98, a discount of only 7 per cent.

North Platte Ranchers To Stage Real Roundup

North Platte, Neb., July 29.—(Special.)—Residents of West Bird creek, in this county, who were cowboys in the days when western Nebraska from Lexington west to the Wyoming line was a free range country, and who roped buffalo as well as steers, are arranging for a roundup on the Harshfield ranch August 22, 23 and 24. These former cowboys are now well-to-do ranchmen and they propose to put on, largely at their own expense, an exhibition of frontier days that will be more realistic than anything heretofore attempted in that line.

The settings will be staged in the open and in a section where no changes have been wrought in over 40 years. Arrangements are being made to get a band of Indians from the Pine Ridge agency, and among these will be some of the old warriors who hunted buffalo on the very ground on which this Frontier day exhibition is held and from the peaks of the sand hills watched the winding of the immigrant trains up the Platte valley.

Fremont College Head Returns From Europe

Fremont, Neb., July 29.—(Special.)—Dr. E. H. Stauffer, president of Midland college and delegate to the International Rotary convention held in Edinburgh, Scotland, returned to Fremont after a two month absence in Europe. He visited various nations following the Rotary conference. The English people, he says, are anxious to keep friendly relations with the Americans and will not support any movement that might be made by avaricious politicians. The people of Germany, Dr. Stauffer reports, feel very kindly toward America, but plainly state that they do not care for ex-President Woodrow Wilson or France. While in Germany he attended a conference of students of the University of Germany.

Legion Man Named to Give Injured Soldiers Money


Lincoln, July 29.—(Special.)—Eugene Holland of Lincoln has been appointed chairman of a committee to work out a plan of distributing interest from the \$2,000,000 appropriation of the last legislature to disabled soldiers, sailors and marines of the world war. The interest, which is to be distributed each year, will amount to approximately \$100,000 annually. The report of the committee will be presented to Dan Swanson, chairman of the board, which is in charge of the fund. Holland is a member of the American Legion.

President Is Invited to Address Sons of Veterans


Lincoln, July 29.—(Special.)—Lieut. Gov. P. A. Barrows, national commander of the Sons of Veterans, has written President Warren G. Harding inviting him to speak to delegates at the organization at the national encampment at Indianapolis in September.
