Three cases were also reported in the William Pasicka family, 4504 South Forty-first street.

Live Stock

Omaha, Aug. 1. Receipts were: Cattle 11,500; hogs 24,000; sheep 1,500; horses 1,000. Monday's receipts of cattle were 11,500 head, 100 of them western range. On Saturday's corn fed cattle the market was not far from steady, best yearlings perhaps a shade stronger with medium and heavy cattle easier. Western grass beefs were generally steady but rather slow sale. Light to good beefs going largely around \$5.00 to \$5.50. Cow stuff was in liberal supply and steady to about 25c lower. Inquiry for stockers and feeders was fairly broad and prices in much the same notches as they were last week.

Chicago Grain

Chicago, Ill., Aug. 1. - There has been persistent selling of wheat by pit traders all through the greater part of the session inspired by the hedging sales of moderate amounts and in anticipation of at least 7,000,000 bushels increase in the visible supply. This developed a situation which resulted in a closing bulge and best prices of the day prevailed at the finish, with gains at 1-1/4 to 1-1/2c record. Most of the late buying was for short account. Corn closed 1-2 to 5/8c lower, while oats were unchanged to 1-3/4c off. Rye declined 2-1/4c and barley 1c. Provisions rallied with pork, 10c up, lard unchanged to 2-1/2c lower and ribs 2-1/2 to 5/8c lower. Local cash sales were 5,000 bushels of wheat, 42,000 bushels of oats and 7,000 bushels of barley. A shipper who sold 100,000 bushels of corn last week had 40,000 bushels of it canceled today. Seaboard reported 200,000 bushels of wheat worked for export.
