Industries of U. S.

On the Up Grade Statistics Indicate

Figures Show Improvement in Employment Situation; Wages in Most Lines Show Decrease.

Washington, D. C., Aug. 8.—Industrial employment conditions in the United States are not yet on a pre-war basis, but they are working that way. Although nearly three years have passed since the world war armistice, American industry is still struggling to get back to a normal condition where factories boomed and there was plenty of work for all.

The most important decrease in employment, shown by these comparative figures, was a 4.6 per cent in car building and repairing, 3.6 per cent in iron and steel, and 37.5 per cent in automobiles.

Comparative data for June, 1921, and May, 1921, show that in 10 industries there were increases in the number of persons on the pay roll in June, as compared with May, and in four a decrease.

When comparing June, 1921, with May, 1921, the amount of money paid to employes and three show a decrease. The most important increases are 11.8 per cent in coal, 9.2 per cent in men's ready-made clothing, and 8.8 per cent in leather.

Cotton Manufacturing—The wages of all employees of the plant were decreased 3.4 per cent. The per capita earnings for June show an increase of 1 per cent when compared with the per capita earnings for May.

Woolen—There were no changes in rates of wages reported for this industry. The per capita earnings show an increase of 1.3 per cent when comparing May and June figures.

Men's Ready Made Clothing—Four per cent of the men in one plant were granted an increase of 10 per cent. All of the men in another plant were decreased 15 per cent.

Leather—A decrease of 18 per cent was reported by one tannery, but the percentage of employes affected was not stated.

Shoe Business Improves. Boots and Shoes—An increase of 11 per cent was granted to 3 per cent of the men in one factory.
