

Federal Board May Interfere With Rail Plan

Pennsylvania Railroad Seems Reluctant to Accept Order Issued Respecting Vote Of Its Employees.

It may be that the reluctance of the Pennsylvania Railroad company to accept an act upon the order issued by the Federal Railroad Labor board will draw attention to some of the intimations which were contained in the testimony given to the senate committee on Interstate Commerce early in the hearings before that committee.

It was observed that Senator Cummins and one or two other senators who are members of the committee question Mr. Warfield upon this part of his testimony appearing with the desire to get a good understanding of what should be the true relation of the Federal Labor board to the railroads respecting the question of wages and kindred matters.

The Pennsylvania Railroad company announced a plan for a new operation between the employees and the company. The plan resembled in some of its features the plan of the Standard Oil company of New Jersey, which was approved by the National Cash register in two earlier years.

A Draught Order. But it has authority over the railroads, and it made use of that authority in order to make a new election by the employees and also ordering that the name of the voter be placed on the ballot. This of course will put an end to secrecy.
