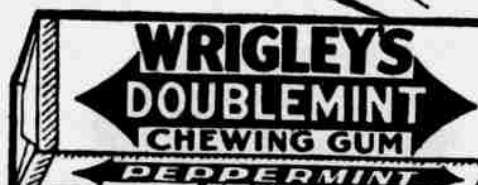

Pineapple Filled Cookies - 1/2 cup butter or butter substitute, 1 cup sugar, 1 egg, 1/2 cup milk, 2 1/2 to 3 cups flour, 2 teaspoons baking powder, 1 cup Hawaiian Crushed or Grated Pineapple after draining. Cream the butter or butter substitute, add sugar gradually and well beaten egg. Mix sifted flour and baking powder and add alternately with the milk to the first mixture. Chill, roll out, put a tablespoon of drained pineapple and one-half teaspoon of sugar in the center of one cookie, place another cookie on top and press the edges together. Place on a slightly floured baking sheet and bake in a hot oven.

HAWAIIAN PINEAPPLE CRUSHED OR GRATED

Garnish. An attractive garnish for salad is the radish rose. First cut off the root of the radish and nearly all of the stem. With a sharp knife make six or eight incisions through the skin at equal distances, beginning at the root and cutting nearly to the stem, and run a knife under each section of the skin. Put the radishes in ice water and leave until the skin has curled back, probably about an hour.
