Again many of the banks, es pecially in New England and also in New York, will have visible proof of the disastrous effect occasioned by the passing of dividends or the postponement of the payment of them. This time this evidence will he furnished through the action of the American Sugar Refining company in passing its regular dividend upon the common stock.

Millions have been invested in the stock of this corporation. At one time it was ranked with the highest grade securities in the United States. The income secured from its dividends has been replied upon with as much confidence as is the interest payment upon government obligations. There was a time when it paid 22 per cent and then against another time when dividends were only 61/4 per cent. But for 30 years the owners of the stock have received dividends until now they are deprived of them.

Upon the income from sugar stocks and from other stocks in which the public made investment was no small part of the reliance placed for a sufficient yearly income to meet all personal and business as well as family expenses. But of a sudden the corporations, beginning a year ago, ceased paying dividends or clae postpened the payment of them to some unidentified day in the future. The result was that many persons found themselves deprived of income upon which they depended. In many cases the owners of these stocks were seriously embarrassed. Some of them had over-extended their operations, and were brought face to face with the imperative need of securing funda.

For this reason banks in New England and in New York have now for some months received offerings of notes which the makers of the notes are anxious to sell or discount. The president of one of the largest of the banks in an industrial district in Connecticut said today that it was amazing to see the paper laid before the bank officers in the hope that it would be bought. Many of these notes were signed by men whose business reputation has been excellent but who found themselves suddenly cut off from income by reason of the passing or postponement of dividends. They saw no way by which they could obtain relief from their immediate embarrassments except by selling their paper. have his whiskers trimmed so that

In many cases the banks have been disposed to aid those who have been thus embarrassed. But in New England there are thousands of women whose sole possessions were in the stocks of corporations which in the past were excellent and regular dividend payers but which have heen compelled to pass their dividends. These women stockholders are perhaps the most seriously embarrassed of all. They, of course, possess no business standing which would enable them to borrow money at the banks upon their notes. The passing of the dividend by the American Sugar company is the latest of these embarrassments.
