> Efforts of Prohibition Leaders To Push Anti-Beer Measure Through at Last Minute Fail.

> Washington, Aug. 25.-Congress ossed the Campbell-Willis anti-beer pill into the legislative scrap heap last night and voted itself a month's ecess, beginning at midnight. After days of stormy filibustering

he "drys" threw up the sponge and abandoned their efforts to force a final vote on the anti-beer bill. Efforts of prohibition leaders to lure the 'wets' into an agreement p vote on a fixed date when conress reconvenes in September were unavailing. After congress returns to its duties on September 27 it is expected that the tax and tariff bills, the railroad funding bill, and the bill to refund the foreign debt, will have the right-of-way and no one would hazard a prediction when the anti-beer bill could be brought up

In the closing hours of the session, the \$48,500,000 shipping board deficiency bill and the \$1,000,000,000 farm export credits bill were finally enacted into law. President Hardng arrived at the capitol shortly befere midnight and signed these two measures in the president's room, off the senate chamber.

Defeat of the anti-beer bill was rendered certain when the house, by a vote of 146 to 129, concurred in the senate recess resolution. The resolution which was passed by the senate several days ago, left congress with no choice but to quit at midnight. As a result, the "wets' were able to talk the anti-beer bill to death.
