Already the Pennslyvania section which is about a mile distant from the Grand Central terminal section is responding to the forecast which was made by President Cassatt. A large bank is to be opened for business operative under state charter in that section in a short time. And a national bank with a capital of \$2,000,000 and a paid in surplus of \$500,000 is to be established nearby carly in the fail.

The Pennsylvania caused to be creeted directly opposite its terminal, the largest hotel in the world. It is conducted in such manner as to make it comparable with the most fashionable of American hotels. Great business structures have been erected in that section, now called "The Pennsylvania Zone," and it is another of the illuerrations of the stimulus to building and to business which is caused by the establishment of a great railroad terminal.
