
When Lord Kelvin visited the United States, in what proved to be his last visit to this country, he was gladly received by Dr. Peter Cooper Hewitt in the laboratory which Dr. Hewitt had established in the tower of the Madison Avenue of the Madison Avenue garden. Lord Kelvin was especially interested in a demonstration of Dr. Hewitt's discovery and invention of the vaporized mercury electric lamp. One feature disclosed in the demon-stration caused Lord Kelvin to be intensely occupied for some minutes. He then revealed himself as one of the master minds in science. It was a peculiarity which Dr. Hewitt had himself observed, but for which he could find no explanation. It was a bubble-like formation which moved around with velocity in the bed of mercury as though attracted by some mystic force, the knowledge of which was beyond the ken of both Lord

Kelvin and Dr. Hewitt.

There was heavy new buying, based on builish crop news and considerable trade buying, as well as support from Liverpool interests. Wall street sold on the advance, but the market continued strong.

The afternoon advance extended to \$15.98 for December and \$17.18 for March, with active months generally selling 50 to 69 points net higher. Reactions of 20 to 25 points followed under renewed realizing, with the market rather unsettled around 2 o'clock. The average estimates by members of the cotton exchange point to a crop condition of 70.3.
