Lamont Chosen to Negotiate Financial Arrangements With Obregon Gov-

> ernment. By HOLLAND.

For the third time within five years Thomas W. Lamont is chosen to negotiate international financial settlements that are of magnitude and the fact that he has been so chosen identifies Mr. Lamont as one of the leaders in American finance at this time. When President Wilson requested his secretary of the treasmry to make choice of an American of long experience and of acknowledged ability as a financier so that it would be possible to obtain good counsel upon the financial features to be discussed at the conference in Paris, Mr. Lamont was chosen, One of his partners, Mr. Davison, was at that time in Europe, but he was occupied in perfecting the final ar-

rangements for permanent Red ross benefactions, principally in Europe. Mr. Lamont's counsel at the time of the conference is surmised to have been of great value. But the details of it will probably never be reported. It is, however, common knowlege that certain suggestions

Mr. Lamout's service involved not merely profound financial knowledge and great financial experience, but also a diplomatic quality skillfully and honorably used by means of which Japan and China came to a good understanding.
