

Prospects Bright for Strong Grid at Nebraska This Season

Eighteen Letter Return to Play On Husker Team

Captain Swanson Turns Down Appointment to West Point to Play With Cornhuskers.

Lincoln, Sept. 17.—(Special)—Two scores of Cornhusker grid warriors turned out Thursday at the word of Head Coach Dawson, preparatory to the opening of the actual football season for practice as candidates for the University of Nebraska team. Eighteen of the men have worn the Husker mole skins in former battles on the field of honor for the Scarlet and Cream, while many others have spent at least one year on the Freshman squad at the university.

Among the older players handlers who will try out for Coach Dawson's eleven are Captain Clarence Swanson, Howarth, Lyman, Weller, Pucelik, Monte Munn, Scherer, Wright, Hoy, Schoepel, Wenke, Rusk, J. Thompson, Bassett, Klumpke, H. McGlasson, Hartley and Moore. From last year's Freshman squad come Berquist, DeWitt, Rens McGlasson, Peterson, Nixon, Moser, Noble, Lewellen and Preston.

Coach Dawson, together with his assistants, Captain "Bill" Day of last year's team and Owen Frank of more ancient Husker fame, does not believe in guessing that the Nebraska team can beat all comers. Neither does he believe that the team can be made a perfect one, but he does believe that he has some splendid material which will mold a strong, formidable, aggressive machine.

Turned Down Appointment.

Captain Clarence Swanson, who turned down an appointment to West Point in order to be with the Huskers this season, has retained the speed which made him a favorite with Cornhusker fans last season. "Swannie" will again go out for the end position, which he has heretofore handled without a peer in the valley. During the summer the Husker captain has again and again been in conference with the coaches and former Nebraska players, getting all the pointers that he could possibly collect in regard to the handling of the 1921 team.

Scherer will go after the other end of the line and stands well to help Swanson get down under punts. Scherer has a lot of speed with experience to back him and handles himself well. Lyman will be holding his own for the tackle job. He returned to the university this fall in splendid condition and has been training for some time preparatory to the coming of the grid season.

Plenty Candidates.

A number of fast, sturdy youngsters are trying out for the backfield. Among them are Floyd Wright, the Nebraska track wonder who hurried Thompson of Dartmouth during several light events in the summer. Wright has a world of speed and is heavy enough to make headway through a mighty lot of opposition. Lewellen, former Lincoln high star, shows up with lots of fast footwork and a true and mighty wallop in his right boot. Lewellen's drop kicks may be a valuable asset to the Husker crew this fall.

DeWitz, Preston, Schoepel, Russell, Thompson, Harold McGlasson, Hartley and Moore are other candidates for the backfield. DeWitz ability to get off quick will help the addition to the varsity in his claim for a backfield position, while Schoepel's speed and weight, Russell's experience, Thompson's whirlwind rushes are still valuable for backfield work. McGlasson will tackle the job at quarterback with Harry Howarth after the same job. Hartley and Moore are also going after the backfield jobs with ambition worthy of note. "Chick" Hartley pulled many forward passes out of the ozone when against high class teams last year and is still in fine shape. The Harvard boy's ability to handle these remains unquestioned. "Dinty" Moore of Lincoln High school will again try out for the backfield.

Monte Munn Back.

Monte Munn will rest his heavy body on the opposite side of center from Bub Weller and his 222 pounds will be a great aid to the Husker team. Munn is six feet, five inches in height and has lots of speed for a large man. His footwork has been developed by boxing workouts and the heavy guard will probably be of great help to him in his attempt to pocket the guard job. Moser and Peterson of last year's youngsters have now lost out on getting into action—add promise great things for the center of the line. They will have Captain Day's years of experience at the center position upon which to draw information. Berquist will have a good year for the opening of the tackle job.

Harold McGlasson, Harry Howarth and Lewellen will all be candidates for the master-mind jobs. McGlasson and Howarth have represented the Huskers before while the former Lincoln high man will be up against experience and skill for the quarterback position.

DeWitz, Noble and the other candidates for the varsity have plenty of speed and ability. Coach Dawson will leave the backfield men to Assistant Frank and trusts that the Scottsville mentor will be able to handle the men with ease. Coach Day will be in charge of the line and has already been putting the men through the elementary work.
