

**Civil War Veterans Choose Des Moines For Next Convention**

Indianapolis, Sept. 30.—After bidding farewell to their comrades,

veterans of the Civil War Army of the Republic closed their annual encampment Thursday. The encampment ended with the election of L. S. Pilcher of Brooklyn, N. Y., as commander-in-chief, and the choice of Des Moines, Ia., for the next meeting.

Other national officers elected were: R. W. McBride, Indianapolis, senior

vice commander; H. A. Johnson, Washington, D. C., junior vice commander; M. W. Wood, Boise, Idaho, surgeon general, and G. B. Smith, Minneapolis, chaplain-in-chief. Among the officers Mr. Pilcher appointed was R. A. Sarle, San Francisco, inspector general.

After discussing action to provide for eventual disposition of the prop-

erty of the Grand Army when its members are gone, it was decided no efforts should be made at this encampment.

The Sons of Veterans elected C. M. Ireland of Peoria, Ill., commander-in-chief. The Women's Relief corps, having elected Mrs. Agnes Parker of Boston president on Tuesday, completed the election today.

**Gen. Pershing Reviews French Troops on Rhine**

Mayence, Germany, Sept. 30.—(By The Associated Press.)—General Pershing, chief of staff of the American army, visited Mayence and re-

viewed French forces of occupation. The 5,000 troops, comprising the French garrison were massed in the city hall square for the review. American and French military bands played "The Marseillaise" and the "Star Spangled Banner."

General Pershing was met 10 miles outside Mayence by French cavalry and escorted to the city hall.

Twenty-one guns were fired in honor of General Pershing, while 2,000 homing pigeons were released, bearing dispatches to the French occupied zone, announcing his arrival.

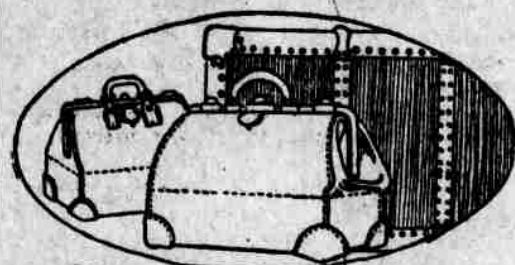

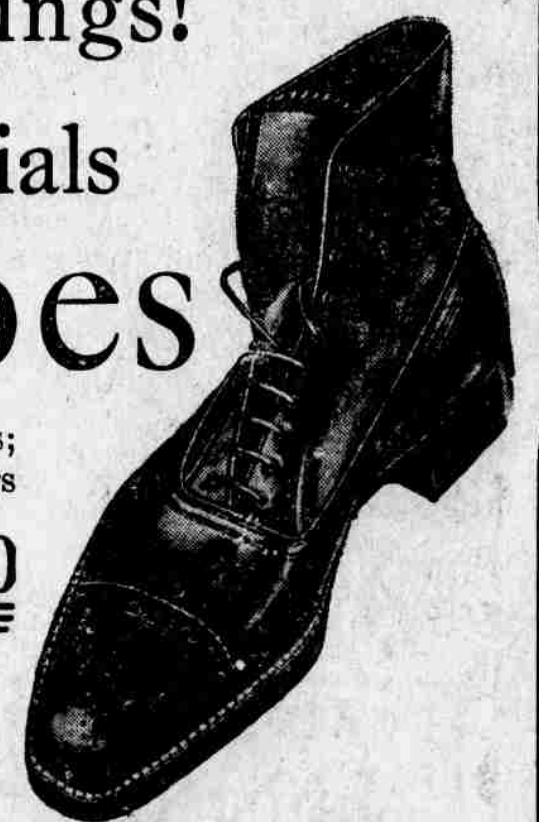
