Pardon and Parole Board Will Hear Cases Next Tuesday

Lincoln, Oct. 1.—(Special).—Twelve Douglas county men are included in the list of 52 applications to be heard by the state board of pardons and paroles at its sessions next Tuesday.

Favel Fenick, serving a 15-year sentence for criminal assault committed in Omaha, is seeking a commutation of sentence. The other Douglas county applicants are: Robert Neal, carrying concealed weapons, not over two years.

Henry Metcalf, forgery, one to 20 years. Albert Bell, grand larceny, one to seven years. Harry Martin, grand larceny, one to seven years.

He was recently arrested in Thayer county on the charge of selling bonds of a Minneapolis investment company with an alleged representation that they were nontaxable and that the state of Nebraska guaranteed them in the same manner that bank deposits are guaranteed.

The state bureau of securities will assist the Thayer county attorney, H. W. Hess, in the prosecution of Wroughton on the charge of making false representations relative to the bonds. State Tax Commissioner Osborne also has an eye on the case because the new revenue law makes securities on nonresident corporations, which are owned in Nebraska, taxable.
