

### Clash Features Discussion of U.S. Work in Alaska

Value of Road Purchased by Government Brings Heated Words Between Joslin and Ballaine.

Washington, Nov. 16.—A heated colloquy between Falcon Joslin and John E. Ballaine, both of Washington state, followed the meeting of the senate territories committee during a hearing on bills to consolidate governmental activities in Alaska.

In testifying as to details connected with the government's purchase of the Tanana Mines railroad, Mr. Ballaine made statements which Mr. Joslin, who had constructed a part of the railroad, challenged and Chairman New had difficulty in restoring order.

Attorney General Rustgard of Alaska presented arguments in support of the New bill, which proposes to consolidate government bureaus in Alaska under the interior department. He emphasized the importance of establishing steamship communication under the bill between the terminal of the Alaska railroad and a Pacific port in the United States, asserting present facilities were inadequate.

The controversy arose over Joslin's resentment of Ballaine's assertion that he had obtained from the government for Joslin's railroad, a value in excess of its cost. Mr. Joslin asserted that the railroad for which the government paid \$300,000 in its own appraisal, had cost

him \$1,000,000 and he was forced to sell after the government had paralleled it.

A telegram from the Seattle Chamber of Commerce was read stating that "Ballaine was not authorized to speak for Seattle businessmen" and that "while the Chamber of Commerce is not controlled by the Guggenheims or any other special interest or group, this organization does recognize that the Guggenheims, instead of throttling Alaska, have done a great deal to develop that territory."

The telegram also stated "The chamber will no longer permit to go unrepresented Ballaine's ungrounded charges."

### Wireless Market News

**Now Sent Out by State**  
Lincoln, Nov. 16.—(Special).—Market news is now being sent by wireless to Nebraska communities, according to announcement made by Leo Stuhl of the state department of agriculture. The service was inaugurated last Monday.

Mr. Stuhl does not know how many towns are "sitting in" on the report. The David City Farm bureau and the Beatrice bureau are getting the wireless report. Under favorable conditions the report can be received at any point in the state, Mr. Stuhl says.

### Bankers and Rotarians Unite to Get Dairy Cows

Aurora, Neb., Nov. 16.—(Special).—The bankers association of Hamilton county and the Aurora Rotary club have joined in boosting the dairy business for this county. The joint committee of the two organizations outlined a program. It is proposed to get a number of farmers together and consider plans for bringing dairy cattle into the county from the east.

### Ellis L. Dresel Named U.S. Envoy to Germany

Washington, Nov. 16.—Ellis Loring Dresel of Boston was nominated today by President Harding to be charge d'affaires to Germany. Mr. Dresel has been American commissioner to Germany and is now in Berlin.

### Steamer Sinks; 50 Missing

Manila, P. I., Nov. 16.—(By The Associated Press).—The steamer Maria Luisa, 54 tons, foundered today off the Zambales coast near the entrance to Manila bay and 50 persons are missing. Rescuers saved 86 passengers and members of the crew. It is believed that all the missing are Filipinos.
