

Plans Made for Another Merger of Steel Plants

Six or More Concerns in New York and Ohio to Be Brought Into One Great Corporation.

By HOLLAND. In one of the addresses which were recently made by Charles M. Schwab, he spoke in favor of industrial combination directed by a single, very able leader, which would permit reasonable competition with other organizations engaged in similar manufacture and would also establish healthful co-operation.

One of the leading business and financial authorities expressed the opinion, having first improved confidence, that a merger was almost inevitable involving several of the large independent steel plants and industrial life.

Steel Merger Planned. This was said in a speech which it is now possible to say that the merger which he referred to in the fall would bring at least six or seven independent steel corporations into a single organization.

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Co-Operation and Competition. It is the opinion of Judge Gary, who is chairman of the board of the United States Steel corporation, does not regard with disfavor the possibility of a merger of this kind.

Large Yet Comparatively Small. These independent companies can produce nearly 3,000,000 tons of steel a year. They are not large, but they are rich and extensive.

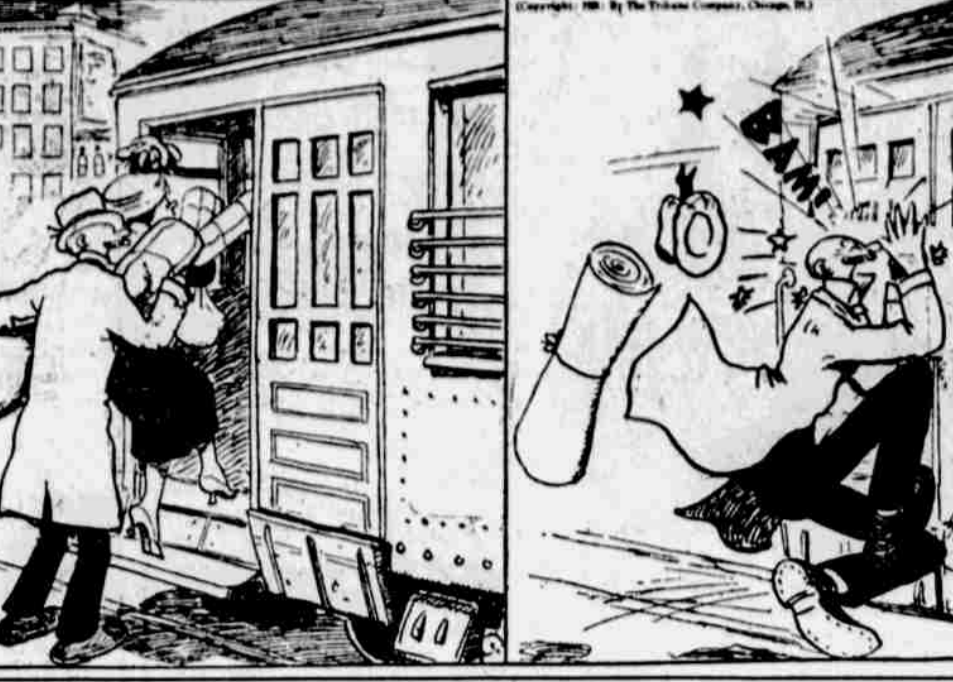
