

\$11,386,000 Spent On Buildings in Omaha in 1921

Amount Within \$50,000 of Total in 1921—Largest Permit for New High School.

Building operations authorized by the city building department during 1921 amounted to \$11,386,000, which was within \$50,000 of the total for the previous year.

The largest permit issued during the year was for the Omaha Technical High school, amounting to \$2,890,000.

Omaha Federal Land Bank Leads In Farm Loans

Local Institution Is Largest Farmers' Co-Operative Institution in U. S., Says President.

With \$3,125,000 paid up capital, \$626,657.07 surplus and undivided profits and \$56,597,340 in loans, the Federal Land Bank of Omaha is the largest of the 12 Federal Land banks and the largest farmers' co-operative institution in the United States.

The suit attacking the constitutionality of the Federal Land banks was decided in favor of the banks, February 29, and immediately the Federal Land Bank of Omaha made preparations to resume loaning operations.

Sold at Par. Forty million dollars of 5 per cent 20-year bonds were sold for the Federal Land bank system in May at par and a like issue of \$60,000,000 in bonds was sold in October at par.

Market Greatly Improved. The market for farm loan bonds has greatly improved during the past three months and there is every reason to believe that a much larger issue of bonds will be taken by investors in the next bond sale than has been taken in the last year.
