

Retail Prices in 16 Principal Cities 12 to 18 Per Cent Lower Than Year

Washington, Jan. 12.-Retail food prices in 16 principal cities in the United States decreased 12 to 18 per cent in the 12 months ending De-cember 15 last, the bureau of labor statistics annumed today. The figures show that prices prevailing last month in 13 of the cities from which 1913 statistics were available had increased since that year from 33 to 59 per cent. During the month from November

15 to December 15, 1921, 12 of the cities reported decreases in food prices and two reported increases. Mobile, Ala, and Savannah, Ga, had the highest percentage of decrease. Other declines included the follow-
