It is probable that he will sitted as many directors' meetings of the Bank of Commerce as is possible. As the great mercantile house of which he is president has a large branch in New York, it is necessary for Mr. Shedd frequently to visit this city. Some citizens of New York are directors in corporations in Chicago or in Boston and it is their custom, unless detained, to go to those citizes in order to attend the directors meetings. In the boliday week a business man of New York who is conspicuously associated with one of the mining interests of the United States went to Chicago solely to attend the meeting of a board in which he is a director. He received his customary fee of \$20, but his round trip, including hotel expenses, cost him hearly \$150, and that was not an exceptional experience. Men From Other Cities.
