

Invented in Belgium A Belgian concern is manufactur-

Berlin, Jan. 21.—Maxim Gorki may never again see his native land. This is the impression that is gaining ground among his friends and colground among his friends and colleagues here.

Gorki came from Russia to Germany in bad physical condition to be treated at Nauheim for a complication of heart troubles. There he developed such a serious condition of the lungs and tubercular complications as to make imperative his removal to a higher and drier climate. On the advice of specialists he was taken to the sanitarium at St. Blazien in the Black Forest.

Today he is in such a weakened without reloading. The arm has two barrels, one above the other, registering with two series of eight holes each in the cartridge chamber.
