

Will Retain Forts Here, Updike Told by Gen. Pershing

Chief of Staff Assures Omaha Posts Not to Be Abandoned—Supply Depot Also Kept.

By E. C. SNYDER. Washington, Jan. 27.—(Special) Gen. Pershing, who conferred with General Pershing of staff, relative to the matter of the forts to be abandoned. Mr. Updike, who has completed his duties at the agricultural conference, his labors having ended the resolutions prepared by committee, of which he was a member, were adopted.

Gen. Pershing assured me that his disposition was to retain either one of the forts, Mr. Updike, "He told me that the forts would continue as headquarters for the troops in the city area, and that the recommendations made by General Pershing to remove some of the headquarters to Fort Omaha would be carried out.

Conferees on Depot. Congressman Jefferis, N. B. Updike and Commissioner Larsen of Omaha Chamber of Commerce, conferred Thursday with Quartermaster General Rogers over the location of the quartermaster's depot here.

Presenting the Omaha depot General Rogers' consideration, Jefferis pointed out that the city and vicinity furnished excellent facilities for the purchase of supplies, and was ideally situated to move the supplies in any action, by reason of many railroads entering the city.

Effects Large Stocks. General Rogers says in his letter to the Omaha people will be on a commensurate list, owing to the reduction of appropriations, and necessary retrenchments in the hands of surplus stores, "the effect will be that large stocks will not, in the future, be maintained at the Omaha depot, but will be disposed of, as the stocks shipped to neighboring post stations.

"On the other hand," says the head of the quartermaster's corps, "the Omaha depot will continue as a purchasing and shipping depot. The fact that a good market territory exists in the city of Omaha is well understood and appreciated by this office, and it is the intention to continue utilizing this market through the Omaha depot as a purchasing and shipping station. You will note, therefore, that the reduction of appropriations, and necessary retrenchments in the hands of surplus stores, "the effect will be that large stocks will not, in the future, be maintained at the Omaha depot, but will be disposed of, as the stocks shipped to neighboring post stations.

Administration Is Wiping Away Tears of World

Coolidge Says Republicans Assumed Control After Nation Had Been Without Leader Over Year.

Indianapolis, Jan. 27.—The accomplishments of the present administration are wiping away the tears of the world and healing the nation, Vice President Calvin Coolidge tonight told the Indiana Republican Editorial association.

Mr. Coolidge said the republican party assumed control at a time when the nation had been without responsible leadership for a year and a half, and that the party had "through the inspiration of a great president, made an honorable record of accomplishment which no sophistry could misinterpret, no misrepresentation could obscure and which was bringing peace and tranquility to the nation."

Declaring that the first great act of the present administration was the selection of cabinet officers "sound and seasoned in public service," Mr. Coolidge revealed the activities of the president and the congress since last March.

"The long pending treaty with Colombia was ratified, an example of justice, running into generosity, which, no doubt, will be for our financial advantage.

"The present administration offered Mexico a treaty, which recognized that government and at the same time protected our interests. This treaty has not been accepted.

"The main object of the special session of congress was to adjust finances. From the work of Budget

Commissioner Dawes, the nation's expenses were reduced from \$5,250,000,000 last year to about \$4,000,000,000 this year.

"The temporary law restricting immigration has relieved pressure from without when there was already fear of unemployment within and thus has protected the working man."
