New York, Feb. 6.—The two points of interest in financial markets, as the week began, were the activity and strength shown by the outstanding investment bonds in the face of the pending expiration of the large new loans, and the firmness of European exchange. The sterling market, which had risen nearly 8 cents last week and 16 cents from January's lowest, was naturally confronted with heavy profit-taking sales, coming from speculators who probably had bought from merchants who were anticipating payments on foreign markets for merchandise shipping abroad.
