

Booktherapy Carried On



Booktherapy is the idea of Miss Fuller, superintendent of the Methodist Episcopal hospital, and is carried on by the women of the Omaha College club domestic education section, under her direction.

Mrs. Karl Jonts, shown in the picture with Miss Fuller, is chairman of the work and appoints three women to go to the hospital three days a week to assume the duties of this new phase of nursing.

The women who do this work are regarded professionally in the hospital, and it is their duty to read and visit with lonely patients, also write letters for those too ill to hold a pen.

Cheery visits, combined with wholesome literature, and letters written home, are an aid in the recovery of the patient; and are considered as such by the heads of the hospital.

Miss Fuller asked the domestic education section to assume this work,

and it has helped the college women to find a service for which their training has well fitted them.

Mrs. Frederick Hill, a member of the section, tells stories in the children's ward once a week.

The women have also become interested in the development of the hospital library. They are helping to catalogue the books and are adding new material to the present collection.

Facts Worth Knowing About Tea

For the woman has no very keen sense of taste so far as tea goes it is far better to buy a labeled brand of tea, put up by some reliable concern, than to depend on her own judgment concerning tea weighed out at the grocery store.

The convenient thing about buying package tea is that if you find it acceptable the first time then you can depend on getting the same flavor whenever you buy that brand.

If you are serving tea in the afternoon it is a good plan to select some more or less usual blend of tea and not to attempt anything unusual. You may like Russian teas and unusual Chinese teas, but your guests may not. Do not select a heavy tea, nor one too delicate in flavor, if you would please the majority of your guests. Nowadays most people prefer black tea to green in this country and it is better not to serve green tea unless you definitely know the preference of your guests.

Teas are either black or green. The familiar green teas are gunpowder, hyson, young hyson and imperial. The more usual black teas include English breakfast, Oolong, Pekoe, Formosa, Sou Chong and Ceylon. Green teas are more stimulating to the nerves and therefore should always be used in combination with black teas.

Orange Pekoe of a good quality blended in small amounts with Ceylon, English breakfast or Oolong brings out all the delicacy of flavor hidden in the tea leaves. Pekoe, young hyson and English breakfast form another good blend and many persons think Oolong mixed with a third its own weight of uncolored Japan tea delicious.

Russian tea brings a slightly different flavor from the lemon slice is dropped into the tea after it is poured. The Russians put the slice of lemon in the cup first and pour the hot tea on it.
