

### Attorneys Favor College Education for Law Students

#### Recommendations of American Bar Association Adopted at National Conference in Washington.

Washington, Feb. 25.—The National Conference of Bar Associations, at its closing session yesterday, adopted practically unanimously the recommendation of the American Bar association that future members of the bar be required to have at least two years college education in addition to their regular law school work.

The action of the conference was in a resolution which, it had been explained, would place the associations under the moral obligation of striving to have this educational standard set up in their states and universities.

The vote was taken in the midst of an ovation to Elibro Root, who had just concluded a stirring appeal to the representatives of more than 150 bar associations present not to permit the "illustrious examples of the successes of the past" block the purification of the American bar of the future.

The delegates were received at the White House by President and Mrs. Harding and last night attended a banquet at which addresses were delivered by C. A. Severance, president of the American Bar association; Attorney General Daugherty; Senator George W. Pepper of Pennsylvania and William L. Frierson, former solicitor general of the United States.

### Stefansson Awarded Grant Squires Prize

Washington, Feb. 25.—The Grant Squires prize, it was announced, has been awarded to Vilhjalmur Stefansson by the National Geographic society for his book, "The Friendly Arctic," which was adjudged the outstanding geographic publication of 1921 by the society's research committee.

The book, a narrative of five years' exploration and scientific research by the Canadian Arctic expedition, was regarded as especially significant because of its presentation of a new view of that region, its climate and its pasturage resources, showing that Arctic Canada can be added to the world's food producing area.

The prize is contributed by Grant Squires of New York, a member of the society's board of trustees and is awarded only on the publication of exceptional books dealing with geographical subjects. Mr. Stefansson in 1919 received the Hubbard gold medal from the organization for notable exploration.

### Commerce and Labor Supply Bill Passed

Washington, Feb. 25.—Without an amendment of consequence, the appropriation bill carrying approximately \$25,500,000 for the departments of Commerce and Labor was passed today by the house. It was the seventh of the 12 annual supply measures to be sent to the senate this season.

Of the total, \$18,500,000 is provided for the Commerce department and \$6,800,000 for the Labor department. The measure went through practically in the form in which it was reported by the appropriations committee.

Included in the Department of Commerce appropriation is \$1,533,410 for the bureau of foreign and domestic commerce.

### California Dry Force Reorganization Finished

Washington, Feb. 25.—Reorganization of the California prohibition enforcement forces was understood today to have been practically completed by Commissioner Haynes.

Changes, it was understood, would include a number of officials as well as a successor for Director Mitchell, announcement of whose resignation is expected when the California reorganization plan is made public.

### Woman Who 'Faked' Holdup Unable to Furnish Bond

Freehold, N. J., Feb. 25.—Mrs. Sarah L. M. Robertson, charged with having caused her Deal (N. J.) home to be robbed last Saturday night for the purpose of collecting \$70,000 in jewelry insurance, began a third night in jail yesterday evening, unable to obtain a \$20,000 surety bond.

### Fathers Swap Babies and Peace Dove Comes Into Newark Homes

Newark, N. J., Feb. 25.—Two fathers swapped babies in the maternity ward at city hospital yesterday and the dove of peace fluttered into two homes where the stork had been a recent visitor.

Mrs. Bessie Verity and Mrs. Sarah Lapore were patients at the hospital at the same time. When Mrs. Verity was discharged she was given a baby boy, although she protested that hers had been a girl.

Mrs. Lapore, discharged at the same time, took home a newly born baby girl.

"How come?" queried the father. "They told me it was a boy."

So he bundled up the babe, took it back to the hospital and there found Papa Verity with a similar bundle. A nurse consulted her records, admitted that she had made a mistake, redistributed the babies to the proud fathers—and collapsed.

### Red Cross to Aid Victims of Flood

#### Moderate Weather Improves Conditions in Iowa—Many Farms Are Inundated.

Dubuque, Ia., Feb. 25.—Accurate estimates of damage caused in northeastern Iowa by floods and by sleet were not available last night because of the demoralization of telephone and telegraph lines leading to the stricken towns.

Bright and moderate weather today improved conditions and it is expected that by tomorrow Red Cross workers, whose assistance has been appealed for, will be able to get into the towns along the Turkey and Volga rivers in Clayton county and determine what aid is needed.

Two inches of rain fell occurred in northeastern Iowa within 48 hours.

A report from Waukon stated that that town still was without lights and power and that the water supply system was badly crippled.

The breaking of a dam near Volga City on Turkey river caused an additional three-foot rise in that river. Thousands of acres of farm land were flooded and many farm buildings are known to have been destroyed.

The water is reported to have been from three to 10 feet deep in the business streets of the towns of this season.

### Man Who Shot Ex-Senator Sent to Pen for 10 Years

Washington, Feb. 25.—Charles A. Grock, 65, who last March 5 shot and wounded former Senator Charles B. Henderson of Nevada today was sentenced to 10 years' imprisonment by Chief Justice McCoy in the District of Columbia supreme court. An appeal was noted and the accused was committed to jail in default of \$15,000 bond.

Senator Henderson was shot while in the senate office building, the bullet taking effect in his arm. The affair was said to have been the result of a grudge of long standing. Grock having held Henderson responsible for financial reverses he encountered in a sheep ranch venture in Canada and subsequent inquiry into his family.

### Garber, Elkport, Osterdock and Little Port Communication Cut Off

Milwaukee, Feb. 25.—Cut off from the rest of the world for two and one-half days, the Fox river valley, in northeastern Wisconsin, last night remains buried under snow and ice, which denies the biggest snow plows and the strongest engines.

Residents of Sunny Point, north of Milwaukee, have asked Governor Blaine to send National guardsmen to dynamite an ice gorge in the Milwaukee river which has flooded a dozen farms and 20 summer estates.

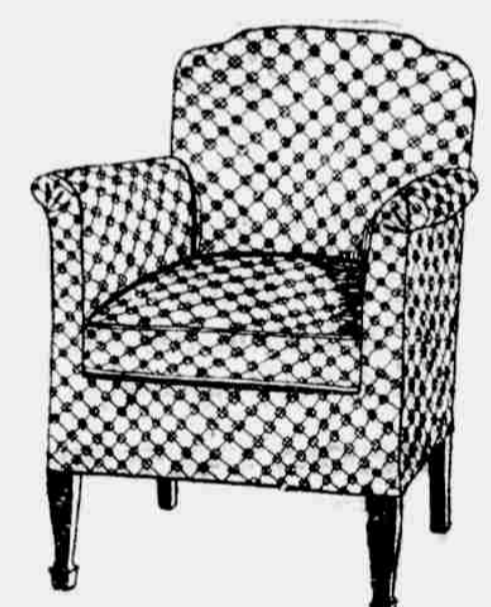
