First, body marks, including an extraordinarily long thumb and peculiarly curved little finger, alike on O'Connor and on Kirkman, And, second, photographs alleged to have been found among O'Connor's eftects in Fremont after he left there and moved to Hastings. The photo-graphs were identified by Kirkman as pictures of his mother. He claims that O'Connor was it.
