Colo., 30 miles east of here, that a man answering Swain's description had been seen here yesterday. The man was not detained there, however, Mrs. Swain, according to the police, believes her husband has become temporarily mentally deranged as the result of an illness from

which he has been suffering for sevcral weeks.




