Reparations Play Part.

The reparations payment no doubt has ite part in this recurrent depreciation; but it is difficult to imagine any equilibrium reatored so long as the present German idea prevails that depreciation has no connection with the \$2,000,000,000 marks of new paper, turned out by the printing press since November.

Today's statement by the Department of Commerce, giving the sources of our gold imports of last month, is curiously interesting. It had seemed, when the Transvaol strike was under way, when the far east was no longer shipping gold and when France was known to be experiing gold only sparingly, that the monthly arrivals in the United States would be negligible.

The department's figures show that from those sources we received last month \$26,000,000 less than in February, 1921. But the receipts from Denmark and Sweden told a very different story; they increased \$12,000,000 from \$42,500,000 in 1921 to \$28,700,000 in 1922.


