

### Millions Repaid to War Board by Corn Belt Banks

Official of Finance Corporation Says Intention Now Is to Aid Livestock Men of State.

More than \$1,000,000 in loans have been repaid to the War Finance corporation by banks in the Nebraska corn belt. John M. Flannigan, executive secretary of the Omaha agency, reports a much stronger business sentiment. The cattle situation in western Nebraska is now calling for attention.

Mr. Flannigan left last night to confer with bankers and farmers at Broken Bow today. He will speak on the business outlook before the Chamber of Commerce at Alliance Thursday night. "Crop records show that unusual yields are not continued indefinitely," he said before leaving. "The preservation of a surplus against a time of diminished production is in line with sound financial policy. This applies equally well to bankers and farmers. It is the intention of the Omaha committee to render every assistance within its power to the livestock men, and the only question is how to do it."

"The grass cattle men of the west half of the state are in a peculiar situation. The consensus of opinion among men in the industry is that grass cattle must bring at least 81-2 cents a pound to sustain the business. Last fall, and up to November, corn belt bankers demanded that
