

Nomination for Governor Begging Among Democrats

"Standbys" of Party Sidelined Plea to Become Sacrifice on Mullen-Hitchcock Political Altar.

Lincoln, March 27.—(Special.)—Seeking a needle in a haystack isn't a bit more discouraging than the search being made by the Mullen-Hitchcock faction for a democratic candidate for governor.

Morehead Blasts Hopes.

Today Morehead blasted his hopes by announcing definitely that he would be a candidate for congress in this district. Petitions to circulate to nominate "Brother Charlie" Bryan for congress in the same district are taken to indicate that he, too, looks on democracy's hope of winning a statewide election as futile.

The apparent withdrawal of Bryan from the gubernatorial race is looked upon by democratic politicians as one of the worst signs imaginable. For, according to them, when a Bryan refuses to become a candidate for a certain office the outlook must be terrible.

One Major Candidate.

Meanwhile, Hitchcock is the only avowed democratic candidate for a major office in the state. There are plenty of democrats running, but their names are going on the third party ticket. J. H. Edmisten, third party chairman, declared that three-fifths of the third party's strength would come from the democrats.
