Women Doctors **Want Medical** Co-Education

Attack Decision of London Hospital Authorities Against Further Admission of Women Students.

By FORBES W. FAIRBAIRN. Sivered Bervice Staff Correc London, April 1. - Medical coeducation in England is in a precarious position as the result of the decision of London hospital authorities to refuse further admission to

Women students.

Women doctors are up in arms and threaten to fight the decision to the bitter end. They assert the step is due to antagonism on the part of men physicians, who are jeal-ous of the progress made by the fair sex in the profession.

Lord Knutsford, chairman of the

hospital responsible for the drastic decision, declares that the medical staff advised it because of the difficulties which arise in a mixed school of men and women students He denied they objected to the med-ical education of women.

"There are unpleasant subjects which have to be taught to all who wish to take up medicine," he told Universal Service. "To teach these pleasant but necessary things to either sex alone is possible, but the hospital staff have found difficulty in teaching those things to a mixed audience and do not wish to continue to do so. Minor difficulties have also to be met, and for those reaalso to be met, and for those reasons the committee consider that we should revert to the old custom of

training men only."

Women physicians who are taking up the gage of battle—and they num-ber among themselves the most prominent women doctors in the world-point to the success of medical co-education in the United States and declare the decision is in every

Dr. Flora Murray, one of the best known women practitioners in Eu-rope, is emphatic in her protest.

"It is not a fact that doctors find difficulty in lecture to mixed audiences," she declares emphatically. "Beneath this excuse is a growing opposition on the part of men in the medical profession to women doctors, who are steadily increasing in numbers. It is because their own

supremacy is threatened." Dr. Louisa Garrett Anderson, one of the first qualified women physicians in England, was equally positive in her assertion that jealousy is the underlying cause of the move-






