

### N. M. Guard Starts for Riot-Torn Part of Coal District

#### Martial Law Declared in Gallup District of New Mexico Following Report of Strike Riots.

Washington, April 8.—Secretary Weeks today declined to send federal troops into New Mexico in response to a telegram from Gov. M. C. McMechen, who said he might need them to preserve order in the Gallup coal fields where martial law was declared yesterday as a result of disorder, incident to the coal strike. The war secretary's telegram sent and made public after he had conferred on the matter with President Harding said: "Unless disorder develops to a point where state authorities are unable to preserve order, federal troops can not be used in connection with the coal strike."

Santa Fe, N. M., April 8.—Martial law was declared in the Gallup coal mining field yesterday afternoon, in a proclamation issued by Gov. M. C. McMechen. Headquarters troops at Albuquerque and Troop D of the National guard at Santa Fe, were ordered to proceed at once to the field. The proclamation was issued on report of an appeal from the sheriff of McKinley county, who reported a riot at Monticore camp. No details of the riot were given.

#### Troops Entrain.

Albuquerque, N. M., April 8.—Four troop units of the New Mexican National Guard left here in a special train early today for Gallup, N. M., for duty in the coal mine district where disturbances by strikers are feared. The men are due to arrive at Gallup at noon.

Adj. Gen. Brown, who went to Gallup last night, has called a conference in Gallup for 2 o'clock this afternoon of mine operators, mine workers' representatives and city and county officials when the governor's proclamation of martial law will be read and rules for its enforcement laid down.

No further disturbance was reported last night.

#### Receive Last Pay.

Indianapolis, Ind., April 8.—Idle coal miners of the country, starting today and continuing next week, receive their last pay, estimated at \$30,000,000, by union officials and regarded by them as a strike fund.

The big wage distribution, an important factor in the miners' ability to continue the general suspension of work that began a week ago, on the order of the United Mine Workers of America, is for the final half of March—in all, 15 working days.

The big sum is several times the total cash of the union organizations—national, state and local—and comes to the miners with an indefinite period of idleness ahead of them. It is the only big cash payment that will come during the suspension, the union war chest not permitting any general strike benefits.

#### Conference Suspended.

New York, April 8.—Union representatives and delegates from the coal operators who have been in session as a wage negotiations committee, suspended their conference today and returned to their respective districts. It was announced that they would resume sessions Tuesday, when their efforts to bring about a settlement of the strike will be renewed.

#### Bedfast Woman Carried From Burning Building

A woman, ill in bed, was carried out a second story window and down a ladder to safety during a midnight fire on South Thirteenth street Friday night.

Firemen were summoned to the second hand store of Abraham Keiser, 1024 S. Thirteenth street, at 11:38 when flames were discovered in the rear of the store, mounting to the second floor.

#### County Official Expires of Wound in Election Fight

Albuquerque, N. M., April 8.—Celso Lovato, county commissioner of Valencia county, died in a hospital here today of a bullet wound sustained at Belen Tuesday night following a heated election.

Lovato's brother-in-law, Santiago Baca, is being held at Las Lunas pending an investigation. He says a revolver he was carrying was accidentally discharged.

### \$935,725 More in Taxable Stock Found by State

#### Large Amount of Stocks Never Placed on Nebraska Tax Roles Discovered by Commissioner.

Investigation by William H. Osborne, state tax commissioner, into Nebraska holdings of intangible property will increase the state tax fund by several thousand dollars, Mr. Osborne stated following discovery of \$935,720 worth of stocks in Nebraska which had never been placed on the state tax roles. That amount represents the holdings of Nebraska stockholders in the American Smelting & Refining company, Mr. Osborne said.

#### Authorized to Investigate.

Under a law passed by the last legislature, the tax commissioner is authorized to inquire of all foreign corporations the amount of stock held by Nebraskans. Two days ago, Mr. Osborne learned that Armour & Co. have \$326,000 in stocks outstanding in this state, of which Elmer M. Morsman of Omaha is said to own the largest block, 520 shares. O. C. American Smelting and Refining company stock in this state, the family of Mrs. Maud Barton of Omaha is the largest holder, said to have 1,502 shares.

#### Will Mitigate Grief.

Tax on intangible property in Nebraska is one-half that on tangible property, Mr. Osborne said. Under the state tax law regarding intangible property several millions of dollars

of foreign stocks held by Nebraskans will be placed on the state tax roles, Mr. Osborne stated, which will mean an increase in the state tax fund of several thousands of dollars.

"This will mitigate the grief of property holders somewhat in that those who have their wealth invested solely in stocks will be compelled to pay taxes on their value," he explained.

### Record Class Is to Be Confirmed

#### Kountze Memorial Church Will Receive 241 Tomorrow and 135 Later.

The largest class in the history of Kountze Memorial Lutheran church will be confirmed today, Palm Sunday. It numbers 241. This is also the largest confirmation class in any one church in the history of the Lutheran church in America.

For 11 consecutive years Kountze Memorial church has had the largest lists of confirmands among the Lutheran churches in this country. Last year Easter confirmands numbered 198. Besides these confirmands, 135 other persons have made application for membership and they will be received next Wednesday evening. This will bring the total membership to more than 3,600.

### Boy Robs Library to Aid Mother

Through his tears yesterday morning Leonard Brown, 12, confessed to Juvenile Judge Sears he stole books from the public library to get money with which to buy food for himself and his mother.

Mrs. Ruth Brown and her son came to Omaha from Kansas City and went to live at 110 South Twenty-sixth street. Everywhere the mother went to get work they objected to having the child with her, she told the judge.

#### Only Dime Left.

Finally one morning, after they had eaten breakfast, they discovered they had but one dime left. Leonard went out as usual and returned shortly after with 75 cents. "I earned it running errands," he told his mother and she accepted the money.

#### Judge Offers Job.

Juvenile Officer Vosburgh, prosecuting the case, told Judge Sears more than 1,000 books have been stolen from the public library in the last two weeks.

The judge sent Leonard to River-view home until his mother can get work, and suggested to the mother that if everything else failed she might get work at his daughter's home.

### Four Citizens' Training Camps for Eighth Corps

San Antonio, April 8.—Four citizens' military training camps will be established this summer in the Eighth corps area, according to an announcement issued by Lieut. Col. Chase Lewis, in charge of the training activities for Texas, Oklahoma, Colorado, Arizona and New Mexico. The Eighth corps camps will operate from July 27 to August 26.

The camps will be established at Camp Travis, San Antonio, for infantry, cavalry and artillery branches; at Fort Bliss, El Paso, for infantry, artillery and cavalry.
