

Mother Who Took Boy Away Held on Kidnaping Charge

Mrs. Stubbs and Son Found in Kansas City After Long Search—Lad's Guardian to Prosecute.

A month's search for Mrs. Anna Stubbs and her son, Cecil Stubbs Ames, 5, is ended, according to police, who say they have word that the two are held in Kansas City.

E. D. Ames, 3544 North Thirty-seventh street, when notified, stated he would file charges of kidnaping against the mother and make efforts to have her returned to Omaha for trial.

Threatened With Gun.
Because she was threatened at the point of a revolver, March 23, Mrs. Ames, who adopted Cecil, surrendered the child to his natural mother, Mrs. Stubbs, she told Wallace Wilson, superintendent of the welfare board.

Mrs. Ames was referred to the county attorney's office with the advice to file kidnaping charges.

Meets Mother.
"I was going with Cecil to a nearby grocery," she told Mr. Wilson, "when I met Mrs. Stubbs and her sister, the latter having a baby buggy."

"I told the mother that my husband and I had legally adopted the boy when he was 2, but she held a gun in my face and forced me to give up little Cecil."

"Then Mrs. Stubbs and her sister ordered the driver of a passing grocery wagon to haul them to the street car."
