Record-Breaking Entry List in State Track and Field Meet Saturday

Predict Old Marks Will Be **Smashed at Games**

The annual state high school championship track and field meet that will be held Saturday at the University of Nebraska field will have entries of athletes far greater in number than in the past years. According to the meets that have just passed, high school athletes are pertorming far above their standard of last year, and record marks should be shaltered in Coach Schulte's meet Saturday.

But one record was broken in the meet last year, however, and a glance at the record sheet discloses that those which now stand have held their places for several years. With weather conditions favorable a number of the records will undoubtedly be shattered.

There will be three distinct championships in this year's meet: Group one, schools having an enrollment under 100 pupils; group two, schools having an enrollment from 100 to 275; group three, schools having an enrollment above 275. Four places will be counted in each event, but each school will be limited to two starters. Bronze medals will be awarded first, second and third places in each event. Special medals will be awarded event champions setting up the highest score regardless groups. Silk banners will be awarded each team that places first, second or third in the total points. A special relay banner will be given to the team making the best time.

Should Lower Records. With the results of the Grand Island, Broken Bow and Hastings interscholastic, the results show that the "prep" lads are going at record-breaking speed, and if the fact of the state meet does not worry defeat-out of such men as De Maranville of Aurora, Rhodes of Ansley, Weir of Superior, Beerkle of Central, Rod-well of Cambridge, and Greenslit of Hastings, these athletes should come close to lowering the state record.

Rhodes of Ansley has twice bettered the state record in the broad jump when he jumped 22 feet 2 1-2 inches in the Broken Bow meet, and 21 feet 7 1-2 inches in the Hastings meet. 
