

Mellon Will Drop Case of Iowa Man

No Further Action Planned Against Men Ousted From Treasury Department.

Washington, May 25.—Secretary Mellon, after a conference with President Harding at the White House late today, announced that no further action would be taken by the Treasury department in the case of A. D. Sumner of Iowa and C. C. Childs of Ohio, who were removed by order of the secretary from the offices of deputy commissioner of internal revenue and supervisor of collectors, respectively, through the consolidation of the offices.

Secretary Mellon said reports that Sumner and Childs would be reinstated were without basis. "So far as the Treasury department is concerned," he added, "the entire matter is a closed issue."

Dispatches from the Pacific coast quoting Assistant Secretary of the Treasury Dover to the effect that if the removal of Sumner and Childs "was a personal matter" he might "be heard from" when called to the attention of Mr. Mellon evoked a reply to the effect that "I fail to understand such remarks."

Secretary Mellon said further that Sumner and Childs were not appointed by Mr. Dover. He could not discuss, he said, any plans for a further reorganization of the internal revenue forces of the government.
