## **Concrete Paving Assured for Road** West of Benson

County Commissioner Stroud Yields to Wishes of Auto Club and Agrees to Oppose Bitulithic.

County Commissioner T. Stroud, chairman of the road committee, yesterday pledged himself before the board of directors of the Omaha Automobile club to vote for concrete paving, class A or B, on road No. 31, extending two miles west from Benson.

This agreement practically insures that the award on this district will not be made for bitulithic paving. which the Automobile club directors strenuously opposed.

"You have persuaded me, but I want to say that you are working against your best interests," said Commissioner Stroud after he defended bitulithic paving, but agreed to yield to the wishes of the club. Deadlock May Be Broken.

County Commissioners O'Connor and McDonald already have expressed their opposition to bitulithic while Commissioners Unitt and Stroud were for this patent paving. Commissioner Neble being absent, here was a deadlock, which promises to be broken, according to the change of front by Mr. Stroud.

The bitulithic people have run this county about as long as I want to see it run," asserted F. L. Nesbit of the Automobile club directorate. Oppose Double Royalty.

"Some of the board may be susceptible to that influence," replied Mr. Stroud, "but I haven't received a cigar from them." Mr. Stroud added that he was intrested in reducing the cost of

county government. Members of the Automobile club opposed bitulithic on the grounds of double royalty, which they said must be paid, and also because they have investigated the merits of bitulithic and concrete paving and are convinced that they want the latter class.
